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

Homecoming – Mission Sunday

Every fall, high schools and colleges in the United States host a celebration that brings former students, benefactors and friends back to campus. Generally, the "homecoming" celebration is built around a school football team that, having played games at other schools, is "coming home" to celebrate with a game on their own field and in the presence of their own fans.

This past weekend, our local high school in Epworth displayed abundant homecoming spirit. There was a pep rally and a parade on Friday afternoon; the marching band led the way, and lots of students and a few alumni paraded down Main Street. In the evening, the football game was a victory for our Bobcats. Saturday was for a formal dinner and homecoming dance. The theme for the evening was Cinderella's Ball. Quite a number of high school students, dressed in their dance-finery, come to the DWC campus to have their pictures taken on our bridge.

Though we don't have a football team, but we do an exceptional job on the liturgy. Generally the Mass opens with a parade of flags from all over the world, representing the homes of our students, faculty and staff. The international music is splendid. And eye-catching clothing from many nations is the expected attire for the feast. We also have a chance to taste-theworld by sampling the many dishes prepared by students, faculty and staff for the banquet.

This year, Fr. Gus Wall SVD, the provincial superior of the Southern Province, will be





the celebrant and homilist. He has wide missionary experience; including a first assignment in Kenya, and more recently, work in the African American apostolate. His presence will also be a "homecoming": since he previously served at Divine Word College as Vice President for Admissions and Recruitment, and then as Vice President for Formation and as the Dean of Students. Currently, Fr. Gus is a member of the DWC Board of Trustees.

Jesus also celebrated a "homecoming" of sorts. From the Gospel of Luke we learn about the time Jesus sent his disciples out two-by-two on a mission to announce the Kingdom of God. They returned, rejoicing that their efforts met with great success. Jesus rejoiced along with them and turned to his Father in prayer saying:

"I give you praise, Father, Lord of heaven and earth, for although you have hidden these things from the wise and the learned you have revealed them to the childlike. Yes, Father, such has been your gracious will" (Lk 10:21).

Many former students from the novitiate and Theologate are expected here for our Mission Homecoming on October 20, along with many other friends and alumni. We look forward to hearing their stories about participating in God's mission, and we will share some of our stories. *It is Jesus, the Divine Word, who will host our celebration. It will be a delight to rejoice with him.*





DWC Alumnus to be Made a Cardinal

On October 6, Pope Francis announced the names of 21 new Cardinals, including two Divine Word Missionaries. They are Archbishop **Ladislav Nemet SVD**, the archbishop of Belgrade, Serbia, and Archbishop **Tarcisio Isao Kikuchi SVD**, the archbishop of Tokyo, Japan. The formal ceremonies will be held on December 8, 2024.

Archbishop Kikuchi was a student at DWC in the English Language Program in 1983. Then, we knew him by his nickname, Yama! All of us share a bit of his reflected glory, especially his strong commitment to the poor and marginalized. For many years he has been very active in Caritas Internationalis, the humanitarian organization of the





Catholic Church. (In the United States the organization is known as Catholic Charities). Archbishop Kikuchi is currently President of the world-wide organization.

On his blog, Kikuchi wrote about his surprise at being named a Cardinal. He noted the honor of two SVD's being given this responsibility and honor during the 150th anniversary of the foundation of our Arnoldus family.

"Another member of the Society of the Divine Word has also been appointed a cardinal. He is Archbishop Nemet of Belgrade, Serbia. He is a brother member whom I have known for a long time.

"Next year, the Society of the Divine Word will celebrate its 150th anniversary. In its 150-year history, there has only been one cardinal, Cardinal Thomas Tien, who was the Archbishop of Beijing and passed away in 1967. I believe that the appointment of a second and third cardinal this time is an honor for the Society of the Divine Word.

"At the same time, this appointment is not just a personal honor for me, but a great honor for the Church in Japan, and especially for the Tokyo Archdiocese, and also for Caritas Internationalis, of which I am currently serving as President."

"I have received many congratulatory messages and emails from all of you. I would like to express my sincere gratitude. I would like to reiterate that I believe I have been entrusted with a role that is beyond my capabilities. I feel humbled by my own inadequacies. I sincerely ask that you all continue to support me with your prayers."

As Archbishop Kikuchi mentions, the only other SVD Cardinal was Thomas Cardinal Tien, who served as Archbishop of Beijing from 1946 until 1967 and as Apostolic Administrator for Taipei from 1959-1966. He was the first Cardinal of China. Previously he was the chair of Fu Jen Catholic University in Beijing. His service



to China and the Church is recognized in one of the stained glass windows in our chapel. His "red hat" represents the service of Divine Word Missionaries in China since 1879, beginning with the arrival of St. Joseph Freinademetz SVD and Bp. Johann Baptist von Anzer SVD.

As a boy, Cardinal Tien knew Fr. Joseph Freinademetz. At the process for the beatification of Fr. Joseph he noted: "The local Christians saw Fr Joseph as a saint... he was always cheerful, modest, humble. He spoke fluent Chinese. Everyone who met him was deeply impressed by his presence. A local catechist, who rarely had something positive to say about foreign missionaries, said of Fr Joseph: "Fu Shen Fu is different from the others he is a saint."





Board of Trustees Meeting


The Board of Trustees met at the College on October 4 and 5. The main meeting was held on Saturday from 8:30am until 2:30pm, after many committee meetings held during the previous days. The reports from the various administrators and committees were discussed and approved.

The principal actions taken were:



- Review the process of **accreditation** by the Higher Learning Commission. The discussion focused on a presentation from Dr. Mathew Kanjirathinkal, our Accreditation Liaison Officer (ALO).
- Review and approve the outcome of the recent "clean" audit report.
- Review and approve some further amendments to the **Bylaws of Divine Word College.** The amendments will be forwarded to the Board of Directors for final approval.
- Review the **Strategic Plan Scorecard** for 2024-2027. The scorecard helps track progress toward achieving the five goals outlined in the strategic plan.

Creating A Culture Of Effectiveness


Institutional Background

Divine Word College, a Roman Catholic seminary in the tradition of the Society of the Divine Word, educates men and women for missionary service through spiritual formation, a liberal arts curriculum, language learning, and mission preparation in a culturally diverse environment.

When required to submit an Interim Monitoring Report to address Criterion 4 B on institutional assessment practices, DWC lacked a culture of assessment. Faculty, staff, and administrators made significant strides to develop one, achieving notable results.

To ensure accountability and collaboration, DWC shares the assessment process and results with all relevant constituents, including religious congregations, alumni, and benefactors.





Student Perspectives


We fostered a culture of assessment focused on institutional effectiveness, incorporating student perspectives on core competencies. Upon their departure from the college, we asked students how well their DWC experience helped them develop these competencies.



Changing Culture

Faculty collaborated to establish a shared understanding of student learning outcomes and created rubrics to assess them. After testing these rubrics in a pilot study, they reviewed them for reliability and validity, sharing results with the DWC community.

Using feedback, faculty refined the rubrics and signature assignments, closing the assessment feedback loop. This ongoing process helps faculty and administrators continuously improve data collection and demonstrate progress toward DWC's institutional mission.



Interlibrary Loan (ILL)

Libraries are committed to resource sharing. ILL is a prime example of this commitment. Libraries around the world join ILL networks in order to share books, articles, research materials, and more with other libraries. The Matthew Jacoby Library is part of two ILL networks: OCLC and SILO. OCLC is the largest resource sharing network in the world. Over 10,000 libraries around the globe participate. That means it is possible to get books in over 30 different languages right here in Epworth. Search OCLC's WorldCat (World Catalog) to see what's out there!



The library is also part of State of Iowa Libraries Online (SILO), which is a joint program of the State Library and the Iowa State University Library. Over 500 libraries in Iowa participate in SILO, including many of our neighboring libraries such as the James Kennedy Public Library in Dyersville and the Dubuque County Library District in Epworth (and 4 other areas).

Can't find a book or article in our library? Fill out an <u>ILL form</u>. It may take up to two weeks to receive a physical copy of a book (it may be coming from 1000s of miles away!). Article requests are typically filled in 2-4 days. The Interlibrary Loan service is for everyone on campus.





Iowa Library Association Annual Conference

I will be attending the <u>Iowa Library Association's Annual Conference</u> this Thursday and Friday. This year's conference, entitled "Anchoring Communities Through Connection and Empowerment," is being held in Des Moines, IA.
