Open the Door to Hope

What did you get for Christmas? Was it what you were hoping for?

Especially for children in the US, those two big questions come up at Christmas time. I asked a few young folk about whether their hopes came true – their responses were enthusiastic, "Yeah!"

Pope Francis did some "gift" opening on Christmas Eve. During the liturgy at St. Peter's Basilica, he opened the Holy Door, one that is only opened during Jubilee years. Since 1300 CE, a special jubilee year of grace has been celebrated every 25 years, and since 1450, the ritual of opening of the door has been observed. The symbolism of opening the door is built on several biblical texts including, "Ask and you will receive; seek and you will find; knock and the door will be opened to you" Luke 11:9.

When Pope Francis knocked on the Holy Door, (the door on the right side of St. Peter's), it opened for him and for all the pilgrims during this Jubilee year. (https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=tLuE6a3q6JQ) In his Christmas Eve homily, Francis asked that we celebrate 2025 as a year of Hope:

"Tonight, the door of hope has opened wide to the world" and "God speaks to each of us and says: 'there is hope also for you!""

"With haste," therefore, he said, "let us set out to behold the Lord who is born for us, our hearts joyful and attentive, ready to meet him and then to bring hope to the way we live our daily lives. For Christian hope is not a 'happy ending' which we passively await, but rather, a promise, the Lord's promise, to be welcomed here and now in our world of suffering and sighs."

As I myself enter the doorway to this year of Hope, a favorite missionary biblical text comes to mind. In the first letter of St. Peter we are instructed: "...sanctify Christ as Lord in your hearts. Always be ready to



give an explanation to anyone who asks you for a reason for your hope..." 1 Peter 15.

One cause of my hope is the arrival of so many new students at Divine Word College since last August. They come to our front door from many parts of the world. In this first stage of their missionary pilgrimage, most start by learning English and then moving on to further studies at DWC or elsewhere. Others go on to new ministries in North America and around the world. Altogether, since August, 48 new students have entered our front door! 32 entered in August, 3 in October, and 13 more in January. We expect a few more students in to begin studies in March.

The new students this year include eleven SVD candidates and one SVD priest. Currently, the student members of the Arnoldus family here at DWC include: 21 SVD candidates, 7 SVDs in temporary vows, 3 SVDs in perpetual vows, 1 SVD sponsored layman, 4 SSpS Sisters and 1 laywoman sponsored by the SSpS.

The second stage of this DWC missionary pilgrimage also fills me with confident hope for the future. During the past year, *47 students have departed*, most for further studies in preparation for missionary service. Looking ahead, 2 SVD students will be leaving soon for ministry, one to Indonesia, another to Jamaica. 1 SVD candidate has just moved to the Theologate in Chicago. Last Spring's 30 departing students included 4 SVD novices and 1 confrere now working in Canada.

The DWC front door is not only a door of hope for new arrivals, it is just as much a door of hope for those who go out from here to share good news.

Pope Francis concluded his Christmas Eve homily with the following: "Dear sister, dear brother, on this night the 'holy door' of God's heart lies open before you. Jesus, God-with-us, is born for you, for us, for every man and woman. With him, joy flourishes; with Him, life changes; with Him, hope does not disappoint."

My hopes have certainly not been disappointed.

NetVUE recently also announced an increase in grant funding available to member institutions, and the VPAA is working on identifying qualifying projects to apply for funding. HLC Update: Progress on Accreditation Assurance

The second draft of the DWC Higher Learning Commission Accreditation Assurance Argument was completed just before Christmas break. Next, the steering committee will meet to review the draft and make one more round of edits and suggestions. The next draft is due Friday, March 21st. After this final draft, the report will go to the Faculty Senate, the Board of Administration, and the Board of Trustees for review and approval. An important next step will be moving the document and supporting evidence to HLC's online system, which will go live later this semester.




Classroom Etiquette

- Students may borrow up to 25 physical items at a time. The loan period for this is 4 weeks (plus 3 renewals).
- Faculty and staff may borrow up to 50 physical items at time. The loan period for this is 8 weeks (plus 3 renewals).
- You can suggest new books or novels for the library to purchase.
- You can fill out an Interlibrary Loan (ILL) form to get books and articles that are not in the Matthew Jacoby Library.
- The library provides research assistance. Email Library Director Liz Winter, or stop by the library to learn more.
- Search for on-site items in Koha, the library's online public access catalog (OPAC). Also, find links to other services and resources: https://opac.dwci.edu/







- Find journal articles and eBooks in the library's subscription databases from vendors such as Project Muse, JSTOR and EBSCOhost.
- Read or listen to books on the Libby app. Learn more about how to download and use Libby: https://help.libbyapp.com/en-us/6103.htm. There are over 10,000 audiobooks (books you listen to) and 15,000 eBooks (books you read on a laptop, tablet, or phone) that are available on Libby.
- Try Kanopy, the library's movie streaming service: https://www.kanopy.com/. There are over 10,000 movies available on Kanopy.
