Lent — A Season for Faith-Seekers

During Lent, adult candidates for baptism are called forward for special blessings and encouragement. In recent years, many dioceses in the USA and around the world have reported a significant increase in the number of adult baptisms. This year it is estimated that 50,000 adults will be baptized into the Catholic Church in the United States. The Easter Vigil will be a busy and joyful time for many pastors and parishioners as they welcome the newly found faith of so many seekers. This is also a great time for missionaries like us who delight in our ongoing dialogue with faith-seekers.

How do so many find their way to the baptismal font? Most come through a process of Christian Initiation extending over many months, and even years. Someone reaches out to them with an invitation, a sign of friendship or a message of hope. The Spirit moves within them and they find themselves seeking a larger life.

Lord, late have I loved You, O Beauty so ancient, O Beauty so new. late have I loved You! You were within me but I was outside myself, and there I sought You! In my weakness I ran after the beauty of the things You have made. You were with me. and I was not with You. ... late have I loved you! You have called, you have cried, and you have pierced my deafness. ...Our hearts, O Lord, were made for You,

and they are restless until they rest in You.

That is what happened for St. Augustine, one of the most famous faith-seekers in the history of Christianity. He was taken aback by the kindness of St. Ambrose, even though he did not yet understand the substance of Ambrose's teachings.

Of course, we know that the love and prayers of St. Monica, the mother of Augustine, also influenced him to come to faith. And the Spirit moved profoundly in Augustine when he heard the famous words, "tolle, lege – take and read." He took up the Scriptures and his life changed. Later, Augustine wrote some extraordinary lines regarding his conversion.





Divine Word Missionaries emphasize reaching out in prophetic dialogue to faith-seekers. We recall the wisdom of St. Arnold when he insisted that "to proclaim the Good News is the greatest act of love for our neighbors." So, what can we do today to help seekers open themselves to the gift of faith?

Prayer and Fasting. Our ministry with seekers can certainly be inspired by St. Monica as we take the opportunity to pray for faith-seekers. Perhaps St. Augustine's words can serve as inspiration for our own prayers for the catechumens to be baptized this Easter and for the many others who are being called to faith. This is the best time of year to pray for faith-seekers, and not only on Sundays! We also can put some extra "flesh" in our prayers by accompanying them with fasting.

Goodness and Kindness. St. Ambrose's kindness toward Augustine reminds us to live the words of the prologue to our constitution: "We propose to make the goodness and kindness of God visible in our life and service." Let our invitations, our words of hope, be wrapped in goodness and kindness.

Bible. Let us be diligent in offering faith seekers opportunities to hear the scriptural message of the resurrection of Jesus and the coming transformation of all things.



150 Years....

Last Sunday, the Second Sunday of Lent, we recalled the story of Jesus' transfiguration. There are moments in life when we may experience holiness shining through our friends and companions. Sr. Eucharia and Br. Ludgerus remembered such experiences with Fr. Arnold. **Br. Ludgerus** (**Henry Mollemeier**) **SVD** worked for many years in the kitchens at Steyl, Rome, St. Augustine's and many other SVD houses in Europe. He was much impressed by some of the conferences that St. Arnold had given to the Brothers. Br. Ludgerus would have known St. Arnold in the last 20 years of the founder's life. In 1935, sixteen years after the Founder's death, Ludgerus gave testimony about Janssen's life and virtues during the diocesan process at Steyl:



"Of supreme importance to him was the veneration of the Most Blessed Trinity. He often repeated the words of St. Francis Xavier: "O Most Blessed Trinity!" He recommended that when we arose in the morning we should make at least one genuflection and adore the Most Blessed Trinity on its throne of glory. He frequently quoted these words of Sacred Scripture: "O the depths of the wisdom and the knowledge of God!" When he began to speak about the Most Blessed Trinity he was so transfigured as to be almost unrecognizable."

Sr. Eucharia (Klara Kaudewitz), SSpSAP, entered the Holy Spirit Sisters of Perpetual Adoration at Steyl in 1901 at 45 years of age. She remained there until her death in 1936. She wrote about her experience of Fr. Arnold's last visit to the Pink Sisters in 1908, just three months before the Founder's death.

"During the Founder's farewell visit in October 1908 we all knelt in a circle in front of the chapel. He spoke to us in a kindly, fatherly and lovable manner, and even gave a formal farewell speech. He was, as it were, transfigured. He went from Sister to Sister and gave each a small picture with his autograph. After he had blessed us, he exhorted us to remain firm in our vocation and not leave the convent."

Scripture to Sustain Teachers

One of my Lenten practices for myself is a return to Scripture. Catholics are often criticized for not knowing Scripture, and those that don't know Scripture are unable to fully engage in interreligious dialogue with those that do. This Lent, I'm focusing on Deuteronomy 32:1-3. The passage is one of the last admonitions Moses delivers to the Hebrews before his death, but the opening is a prayer of hope that can inspire our teaching.



Deuteronomy 32:1-3 (NASB)

"Listen, you heavens, and I will speak;
And let the earth hear the words of my mouth!
May my teaching drip as the rain,
My speech trickle as the dew,
As droplets on the fresh grass,
And as the showers on the vegetation.
For I proclaim the name of the LORD;
Ascribe greatness to our God!"

Lent is a time of learning what keeps us from God, learning to overcome those obstacles, and learning to do better. Our institutional learning outcomes articulate skills to learn how to do better; think critically, communicate effectively, be intercultural, social justice driven, and mission focused. I offer this Scripture as a prayer for all teachers; may our words contribute to an eternal spring of hope in the Gospel.


Assessment Bites







